


Artwork on the Resurrection completed in Years 1 and 2 and placed in RE books has been very inspiring.

National Smile Month: 13 May - 13 June! Warwickshire Health and Wellbeing:

According to Public Health England almost a quarter of 5 year olds have tooth decay with an average 3 or 4 teeth being affected.

Prevention is always better than cure, therefore please encourage and supervise your child/ren to clean their teeth twice a day and ensure they visit the dentist for a check-up every 6 months even if there are no problems with their teeth. NHS dental care for children under 18 is free. Children should also limit sugary food intake as we know that sugar harms teeth. You can speak to your

Dentist if you have any concerns about your child's oral health.
