The Arts Week was launched with an assembly on Monday. The children reflected on images of Mary that we can see in artwork, icons and sculptures through the centuries. We saw images that showed her as the mother of Jesus and the queen of heaven. There was an interesting sculpture that showed Mary with seven swords and the children suggested the seven occasions when Mary was very worried or sad as a loving mother seeing the suffering of her son!

In our Mission Assembly we reflected on the 'New Commandment' from Jesus: 'Love one another as I have loved you'. (John 13:34-35). It was a wish that Jesus made at the Last Supper knowing that he was about to suffer and die for us. We read words from Pope Francis: 'The first thing you must do: love with deeds, not words. Words are taken away by the wind! The one who loves, gives to God and to others'. Pope Francis also asks us to remember that Jesus set an example to us as he died for everyone: 'The Lord has saved all us, with the blood of Christ: all of us. Everyone.' The Holy Father has set us a challenge when he says: Love with deeds, not words.'
