<u>Time Tables – how many do</u> <u>YOU know?</u>

The National Curriculum states that ALL children need to know



their Time Tables 1x 2x 3x 4x 5x 6x 7x 8x 9x 10x 11x 12x by the end of Year 4. We know that some children are really quick to learn Time Tables and some children need LOTS of reinforcement to recall facts quickly. Children need to be able to recall facts quickly when using the operation of multiplication or division. Time to Shine


