To help in this task you will shortly be receiving a questionnaire which encourage you to complete and return to school asap.

We are fortunate to have two excellent parent governors who can offer sound advice from a parents' perspective and hope to appoint a new Foundation Governor from the parent body soon.

However, you don't have to be a governor to help with marketing our lovely school and the questionnaire will provide essential information and give you the opportunity to offer your support.

At our FGB Mrs Batson updated Governors on all the measures put in place for the new school year which I won't repeat here; suffice to say that we've been kept fully informed and have been able to approve all the measures taken to keep your children safe. We're so pleased that Care Club, managed by our lovely Mary Daly, is back up and running and offers you parents the support many of you need to balance work and childcare.
